


Center - ½ yard - 44 width

Insul Bright - ½ yard - 45 width

This month we will be working with decorative thread and mitered corners. This is a very easy technique and is a great way to show off all those beautiful threads you have in your stash!!! The sample below is an 8" square and works great as a pot holder – I use Insul Bright as the middle layer and then a print for the center fabric. I'll have Insul Bright available for purchase at club, \$3 per half yard.


2-8" pot holders

1 - 8" x 20" trivet

1 - 15" x 20" table mat

Back and Border - 3/4 yard - 44 width

Center - 1/2 yard - 44 width



MAKING THE MITER


Fold the fabric on the diagonal matching the cut edges

Measure over and up the amount of the desired border, less the seam allowance.

Example – 2" border Measure over 1 34" and up 1 34"

Trim all 4 corners

90 from Sild



STITCHING

Set up for 3 thread Overlock wide
Width – widest
Length – 2 – 3 – this will depend on your
thread
Differential Feed – N
Knife – Unlocked
Stitch Selector – A

Use decorative thread in the upper looper

Stitch the edges with the right side up




STITCHING THE MITERED CORNERS

Set up for 4 thread Overlock
Width – widest
Length – 3
Differential Feed – N
Knife – Unlocked
Stitch Selector – A

Fold the fabric, right sides together

Stitch the seam

Repeat for all of the corners



This what you should have when all of the corners have been stitched	
Turn right sides out and press Add Insul-Bright and center fabric Tack into place at corners or stitch around the border with a single stitch
